San Antonio Mobility Cart Spotted In Liberia



In our September 2017 newsletter, Mobility Worldwide TX-San Antonio reported that we contributed 33 Mobility Carts to a larger shipment of Carts made at various shops across the US that were to be shipped to Liberia, Africa. Thanks to Kathy Maynard of Mobility Worldwide (International) for passing along the next chapter in the story: the Carts arrived! They were then distributed by the United Methodist Women in Liberia to those in need. One of the recipients is Abel Gbeadquoi, pictured here (L), a junior student at the Nimba Community College. He has not been in school recently because he lacked a wheelchair. However, Abel now says, "I will return to school as of January 2018 with this new wheelchair."

The United Methodist Women in Liberia reported they received about 180 Mobility Carts, worth \$54,000. That's quite an investment in the lives of these citizens, but well worth it. Richard Baldwin, volunteer in the San Antonio, Texas workshop, recognized from the photo that the man in the front row, below left, received a Cart from San Antonio, which he identified by our

unique way of installing the seat bracket (different from the other shops).

This Mobility Cart, now in Nimba County in northern Liberia, was made in the San Antonio shop!

According to Rev. Rose Farhat, director of Liberia's United

Methodist Women, the distribution of the wheelchairs in Liberia is the women's way of addressing the needs of their sisters and brothers who are physically challenged. Rev. Farhat said that the prayers of the physically challenged, especially those with mobility problems, have been answered. She stated, "You all prayed for wheelchairs and someone in the United States of America heard your prayers."

Jartu Morris, a female recipient, said the Mobility Cart would help her cover more distances, adding, "No more spending money on motorbike taxis for transportation." Another recipient, Eric Gboluma, pointed out that the hand-cranked Cart will reduce the use of his palms on his regular wheels, which he uses to propel his regular wheelchair.






TRACKING YOUR DONATIONS

Production, Shipping, Income, and Expense Reports for 2017

Functional Expenses



The numbers are in and we are pleased to report to our supporters how we handled your donations and how many lives you touched in 2017 by giving them the "Gift of Mobility."

Last year, we built 176 Mobility Carts, which is 26 over our goal of 150. To build that many Carts, it took our volunteers 3,250 combined hours. And we shipped 155 of those Carts to Acuña, Mexico; Monterrey, Mexico; Liberia (Africa); and Honduras.

This pie chart shows our expenses for 2017, with \$50,361, or 92% of total expenses, going directly to Programs related to the Carts. The remaining 8%, or \$4,580, covered our Newsletter, Other Marketing, and Administrative expenses.

Our total income for 2017 was \$49,711. Our total expenses were \$54,941, or \$5,240 over income. Our goal for 2018 is to make up this financial shortfall and to build 200 Carts.

THE COST OF BUILDING A MOBILITY CART HAS DECREASED!

You heard it right! While the overall cost of raw materials for constructing the Mobility Carts increases with the number of Carts produced and shipped, our overhead, administrative costs remain relatively constant (rent, insurance, utilities, etc.). Therefore, while it previously cost \$350 to build one Cart, the numbers for 2017 show an encouraging trend. With \$54,941 in expenses to build 176 Carts, that calculates to just \$312 per Cart! And with a goal of building 200 Carts in 2018, the cost per Cart should decrease even more. In other words, your donations will touch the lives of even more disabled people!
