# Back to School, Thanks to You!



In Chitimbe Village, Malawi (Africa) sits a 22-year old young lady waiting for a miracle. She is physically challenged and had been carried to school in the arms of a family member every day. The inability to walk meant she could not get to school on her own. Her mother had four other children to care for and could not carry her back and forth each day. So, she ended her schooling at grade 5.

Her name is Aisha, and seven years ago she fell ill for a long period of time. Her legs grew weak and she stopped walking. They believe the cause was malaria.

Aisha's village is close to Lake Chilwa (the second largest lake in Malawi), and social workers stated there is much malaria in the area due to the many mosquitos that breed in the dirty water. Most of the poor residents are unable to take their children for medical treatment, and maria is still very prevalent in this region. And very serious!




Many have died from malaria in this area and many others have been left disabled.

Volunteers from Mobility Worldwide in DeMotte, Indiana, were on a mission trip to Malawi and they had heard about Aisha. While searching for her, they passed other children on the dirt road playing sporting games. However, the girl they were looking for could not get out and play with the other children.

Then they spotted Aisha, patiently sitting under a tree nearby. She was one of twenty that day to receive a Mobility Cart.





# MOBILITY WORLDWIDE 2019 ANNUAL CONFERENCE

We're turning 25! That's right -- Mobility Worldwide began making Mobility Carts in 1994, while the San Antonio, TX affiliate workshop opened in 2004. Since starting in 1994, Mobility Worldwide and its current 29 affiliate workshops have produced 76,000 specialty wheelchairs, shipped them to 106 countries, and worked with 70 distribution partners to get the Carts to the disabled people living in developing countries who most need them.

The 2019 Annual Conference will be held in Austin, TX this year at Bethany United Methodist Church and will be hosted by the three Texas affiliates, Austin, Brazos Valley, and San Antonio. The dates are September 26-28. There will be an Innovator's Workshop and several Informational Sessions, topped off with an Anniversary Dinner Celebration.
