The Need

Over 65 million people need a wheelchair! In most developing countries, few of those who need wheelchairs have access and there are insufficient production facilities available. (21st World Congress of Rehabilitation International, World Health Organization, the U.S. Agency for International Development, the International Society for Prosthetics and Orthotics, and Disabled People's International, 2008).

Of the more than 18 million amputees around the world, about 80-percent of those live in developing countries. ("Bringing Prosthetics to Developing Countries." Atlanta Business Chronicle, May 2010).

Our Mission

Our mission is to provide Mobility Carts (specialty wheelchairs) at no cost to individuals with disabilities who live in developing countries and who have no appropriate means of mobility by: operating a manufacturing site to construct Carts; educating the public about the great need of disabled and disadvantaged persons; raising funds to support the construction and delivery of the wheelchairs; and disseminating the wheelchairs to the applicants through international agencies and sponsors.

Mobility Worldwide is an international volunteer, nonprofit, charitable organization made up of 20+ production facilities located in the US and in the African countries of Sierra Leone, Liberia, and Zambia. Its purpose is to reflect God's love by bringing mobility and dignity to those in developing countries who are unable to walk. Mobility Worldwide began in 1994, while the San Antonio (Texas) affiliate workshop came onboard in 2004. In those 30 years of manufacturing Mobility Carts, 100,000 Carts have been built and distributed within

117 countries. Carts are donated, free of charge, to distribution partners who handle the shipping, importation, and assessment of beneficiaries before giving them away to those in need.

The applicant for a Mobility Cart from Mobility Worldwide chosen to receive Cart #100,000 is Sr. Aristides Antonio Mejia, a 50-year old resident of Quezaltepeque, El Salvador. Sr. Mejia has faced extraordinary challenges throughout his life. Drafted into the El Salvador Civil War at just 16 years of age, he endured a traumatic injury caused by an improvised explosive device (IED) that claimed his left leg and severely damaged his right. He is a devoted father of two daughters and a cherished grandfather of four grandchildren. His resilience and determination have been a source of inspiration to many.

Mobility Cart #100,000 represents a life-changing moment that will provide Sr. Mejia with newfound freedom and independence. Built by dedicated volunteers, Mobility Carts offer individuals a means to move with ease and dignity, enhancing access to education, employment and social activities. "Our vision at Mobility Worldwide is to create a world where all people with disabilities, regardless of their social-economic status and birthplace, have free access to mobility solutions that enable them to live with independence and hope," said Margot Newcomb, Mobility Worldwide's Board Chairperson. "This milestone underscores the importance of our mission and further empowers us to continue making an even greater impact." 2,000 CARTS: A MORE PERSONAL CELEBRATATION!

As you have read elsewhere, there are 20+ "Affiliate" manufacturing sites in the US contributing to the overall production of Mobility Carts. Some of these workshops are small and some rather large. The San Antonio shop would rank in the smaller, one-third of the shops based on annual production. Local financial support, number of volunteers, and overall work space dictate the number of Mobility Carts a shop can produce.

So even though some of our workshops had been up and manufacturing Carts for 10 years when San Antonio came onboard, we are quite proud of the 2,000 Carts we have produced in our 20 years!

And wouldn't you know, as we got close to making that Cart #2,000 and kept pointing it out to everybody, we somehow let it slip through our hands without taking pictures of it or celebrating the achievement. So when we looked for it, we discovered #2,000 had gone out in the February 23, 2022 shipment to Fresnillo, Zacatecas, Mexico. However, we did catch Cart #2001



and took a photo of our "Monday Volunteers" standing with the Cart and a second photo of the "Friday Volunteers" with the Cart.

Congratulations, San Antonio, on our achievement of having produced 2,000 Mobility Carts! And thank you to our numerous financial supporters who helped make this possible!

Maria was introduced to Mobility Worldwide TX-San Antonio in 2009 when a group of people living at Hill Country Retreat by Del Webb heard a presentation about our specialty wheelchairs and toured the workshop. She became interested in possibly volunteering there, however we soon moved to a larger and more permanent workshop near the San Antonio Airport and the drive became prohibitive. When the person who had been stitching the buckles to the Mobility Cart seatbelts was no longer available, Maria was contacted and she expressed much interest in joining us as a volunteer. That was 15 years ago, making Maria one of the longest-tenured volunteers!

Maria has an interesting background of having been raised in Germany, came to the United States in 1966, has volunteered at several National Parks, and took a roadtrip to Alaska in 2000. She has worked for the Cruise Lines, been in 100 countries, was a housewife and raised her children. Maria currently keeps active by playing tennis weekly.
